



IMPORTANT CUSTOMER INFORMATION - YOUR RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

Elders Telecommunications Pty Limited ABN 92 117 261 864 or the Elders group company used to provide the Service to you (we) will provide you the Service (the service) on the terms of the Elders Broadband Satellite (Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program)) Terms and such other documents referenced in those terms (collectively, the agreement), unless you have entered into a separate written agreement with us (in which case the terms of the written agreement will apply). The agreement contains full details of the service and the terms and conditions of supply of the service including charging, billing, term and cancellation. This is a summary of the agreement only. It is designed to give you information about what the agreement covers and some of its important terms. If you would like more detail about your rights and obligations, you should read a copy of the agreement. SUMMARY OF MATERIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Description of the service:

The particular details of the service you have selected are set out in the Elders Broadband Satellite (Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program)) Terms, which form part of the agreement between you and Elders. You should have regard to the Elders Broadband Satellite (Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program)) Terms for details of that service.

In summary, the service is a broadband internet service which provides access to the Internet and related services (for example email) via a VSAT, by accessing available satellite bandwidth. The service is a 2 way service and your computer will send and receive data by accessing satellite bandwidth. The service includes: internet access, a peak data speed of at least 256 kbps (to you) and 64 kbps (from you), an average data download and upload speed of at least 60% of the peak speed (at least 75% of the time) measured according to a prescribed *Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program)* testing schedule for test computers located in different geographic regions, a minimum monthly usage allowance (download and upload) of at least 500 MB, availability 99% of the time (averaged over a quarterly period), free 24 hour fault reporting, a staffed helpdesk available during the hours of operation (specified at

<http://www.elderstelecommunications.com.au>), usage information updated daily (if usage limits apply) and information about current usage and associated costs (if requested by you) and a data testing tool.

Provision of the service:

Non fixed-length agreement: We will provide the service until it is cancelled in accordance with the agreement.

Fixed-length agreement: We will provide the service for the minimum term of the agreement or until the service is cancelled in accordance with the agreement.

Conclusion of minimum term of fixed-length agreement:

If neither you nor we cancel the service at the end of the minimum term, the agreement will become a non-fixed length agreement.

If you do not wish to continue the service at the end of the minimum term, you must notify us of this before the end of the minimum term.

If we will not provide you with the service at the end of the minimum term or will change the terms of the agreement at the end of the minimum term, we will notify you before the end of the minimum term.

Changing the agreement:

Non-fixed-length agreement: We may change the agreement by complying with the Telecommunications Legislation (by giving you reasonable notice of the change if we reasonably expect it to adversely affect you).

Fixed-length agreement: We may change the agreement by complying with the Telecommunications Legislation in the same way as mentioned above and, in those circumstances set out in the agreement only, by giving you 21 days notice in writing (eg by bill insert) of the change and allowing you to cancel the service within 42 days of giving notice without paying fees or charges, other than those set out in the agreement.

Unless otherwise set out in the agreement, you cannot make any changes to the agreement without our consent.

Personal information about you:

Personal information about you includes your name, address, credit rating and may include numbers you have called and the time and location of a call.

We may collect, use and disclose personal information about you:

- to decide whether to start, stop or limit supply to you of credit, the service, or products and services of other Elders group companies. If you do not supply part or all of the personal information we request, we may refuse or limit the supply to you of credit or the service.

- for purposes related to the supply of the service (including account management, business planning, product development) and to provide you with information about promotions, as

well as products and services of other Elders group companies and other organisations. You may opt out of receiving communications that are not related to your account or legally required by contacting customer service.

- from and to: credit reporting agencies, credit providers, another Elders group company, unrelated third parties, suppliers and joint venture partners (but only for the purposes set out above).

We may be required or permitted by law to collect, use or disclose personal information about you from and to, for example: the operator of the Integrated Public Number Database, emergency services organisations or to law enforcement agencies. Subject to applicable law, you may access and correct your personal information by contacting us. Further privacy information is available in our Elders Privacy Policy which is available at

Use of the service:

We will provide the service to you with due care and skill. You must use the service in accordance with the agreement and ensure that any person you allow to use the service complies with the agreement.

Equipment:

You are responsible for any damage, loss or theft of any equipment owned by us, except if it is caused by us or our personnel. Unless otherwise agreed, you will purchase the equipment from us as part of the service. The equipment supplied by us will be owned by you from the date that we receive the high cost incentive payment relating to the service under the Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program) and from that date you must insure that equipment against loss or damage caused by accident, natural disaster, vandalism and theft.

System Reconfiguration affecting Satellite Bandwidth:

We may conduct a system reconfiguration provided we give you at least 21 days notice of any system reconfiguration that materially affects your service (except in an emergency). You must comply with any reasonable instructions we give you. If, after a system reconfiguration, you are unable to continue receiving the service without incurring material costs, you may cancel the service by giving us notice within 42 days after our notice to you of the system reconfiguration.

Fault reporting and rectification:

We will repair faults within our network, other than irrecoverable failures in the satellite network or lack of availability of satellite bandwidth. We are not responsible for repairing any fault in the service which is caused by a supplier's network, equipment that is not owned by us or facilities outside our network. If we



investigate a fault that is caused by equipment that is not owned by us, we may charge you for the cost of investigating and repairing the fault.

If we investigate a fault and determine that the fault is caused by your breach of this agreement, a negligent or fraudulent act or omission by you or a failure of any of your equipment, we may charge you for investigating and repairing the fault. We will provide a 24 hour fault reporting service for you to report faults. Before reporting a fault you should try to make sure that the fault is not caused by equipment that is not owned by us.

Fees and charges:

Information about fees and charges under the agreement is set out in the standard pricing table of the Elders Broadband Satellite (Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program)) Terms.

You are responsible for paying the fees and charges for the service (set out in the standard pricing table or under a promotion or offer made by us), any additional fees and charges under the agreement (including your application) and those fees and charges which are notified by us in accordance with the agreement. You must pay all fees and charges incurred for the service, even if you did not authorise its use, the service is unavailable or you are unable to access the service (see Complaints and disputes).

Charges may include: usage charges, access fees, administration charges, suspension or cancellation fees, late payment fees, payment dishonour fees and reconnection or reactivation fees. The amount of the service charges will depend on the service you select. If you would like further details about our charges, please refer to the standard pricing table in the Elders Broadband Satellite (Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program)) Terms for the particular service you have selected.

We may ask you to make a pre-payment usage charge or an interim good-faith payment (including for example, if there has been an unusually high use of the service). We may offer promotions or offers in connection with the service (specials). If you accept a special, the price and terms of the special will prevail over those otherwise applicable under the agreement for the duration of the special until the special expires and then the full terms of the agreement will apply.

Payments:

Unless otherwise agreed, you must pay the service charges by direct debit payment from your credit card or nominated bank account. You will receive an electronic payment advice by email; but will not receive a monthly invoice, unless the amount to be deducted by direct debit

from your credit card or nominated bank account differs from the amount deducted in the previous month. If your payment is declined we may immediately suspend or cancel the service and we may charge you a fee. We may include unbilled service charges in a later bill(s). You must pay each bill in full by the due date shown on it, or as otherwise notified by us. If you do not pay your bill by the date payment is due we may charge you a late fee, suspend or cancel the service (in which case we may charge you a suspension fee and/or reconnection or reactivation fee), engage a mercantile agent to recover the money you owe us, institute legal proceedings against you to recover the money you owe us and on-sell any unpaid amounts to a third party (in which case you will be responsible to the third party for payment of the bill).

Taxes:

Unless indicated otherwise, the fees and charges set out in the agreement include any taxes (for example, goods and services tax). Where the fees and charges do not include taxes, we may increase those fees and charges in accordance with the agreement.

Complaints and disputes:

If you have any complaints in connection with the service, you may complain in writing (via our feedback page on our website, http://www.elderstelcommunications.com.au/got_o/feedback) or by calling us. We will handle your complaint promptly in accordance with our standard complaints procedures.

If we are unable to resolve your complaint to your satisfaction you may take your complaint through other avenues, such as the Telecommunications Industry Ombudsman, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission or the Department of Fair Trading or Department of Consumer Affairs in your state or territory.

If your complaint is about a fee or charge for the service, we may suspend payment obligations for that fee or charge until the complaint is resolved. All other fees and charges not in dispute remain due and payable.

Where your complaint is about a significant and sustained loss of access to, or use of, the service and the loss was not as a result of circumstances reasonably attributable to you or non Elders owned equipment, you may be entitled on request to a refund or a rebate of any access fee for the period in which you access or use was interrupted.

Cancelling the service:

Your right to cancel the service

You may cancel the service at any time by giving us 30 days notice, however in doing so you may become liable to pay

us a cancellation fee. You may also cancel at any time without liability, by giving us notice, if there is no satellite bandwidth available for 30 days or more or if we breach a material term of this agreement and cannot remedy the breach or do not do so within 30 days of you giving us notice to do so.

If you acquire the service through door-to-door sales, telesales or telemarketing sales, you may cancel the service before the end of the cooling-off period set out in the relevant legislation in your state or territory.

Our right to cancel the service or application

Non fixed-length agreement: We may cancel the service at any time by giving you at least 30 days notice, if we have provided you with the service for at least three years from the service start date.

Non fixed-length agreement or a fixed-length agreement: We may cancel the service at any time if: there is an emergency, we reasonably suspect fraud by you or another person, any amount owing to us is not paid by its due date and you do not pay that amount within 10 days of receiving notice from us, we reasonably consider you a credit risk because of an amount owing to us or any Elders group company, you breach a material term of this agreement and cannot remedy the breach, or do not remedy the breach within 30 days of receiving notice from us, we are required to do so to comply with an order, instruction, request or notice of a regulator, emergency services organisation, other competent authority or under law, you become insolvent and we reasonably believe we are unlikely to receive payment for amounts due, you die or, if you are in a partnership, the partnership is dissolved and we reasonably believe we are unlikely to receive payment for the amounts due, the service is suspended for more than 14 days, an intervening event prevents the supply of the service for more than 14 days or we are otherwise entitled to do so under this agreement.

We may also cancel the service if any of the representations or information you provide to us is false or misleading or comes to be false or misleading or you apply for a service to which you are not entitled under the Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program), and in such case (a) title to any equipment supplied by us that has passed to you, automatically reverts to us and (b) you must immediately return all such equipment to us.

Prior to the provision of the service, we may cancel your application immediately by notice to you without liability and without any obligation to provide the service if, in our opinion, it



appears unlikely that we will be paid a high cost incentive for the service under the Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program) owing to the unavailability of funds under that program.

How you can cancel the service

You can notify us that you wish to cancel the service by calling us.

What happens if the service is cancelled?

If the service is cancelled: you are liable for any charges incurred up to and including the date the service is cancelled, you authorise us to use any over payment on your account/money paid in advance to pay for any undisputed outstanding charges, if there are no outstanding charges and the service is not a pre-paid service we will refund on a pro-rata basis any over payment and money you have paid in advance for the service, if you are required to pay for the service by direct debit payment you authorise us to debit any undisputed outstanding charges (including cancellation fee) from your credit card or bank account.

If the service is cancelled during the minimum term of a fixed-length agreement due to circumstances attributable to you, you must pay us the cancellation fee.

If the service is cancelled due to circumstances attributable to you and we reinstate the service, you may have to pay a reconnection or reactivation fee.

Suspending the service:

Our rights to suspend the service

We may suspend the service at any time without liability if: there is an emergency, to allow us or a supplier to repair, maintain or service any part of our network or a supplier's network, we reasonably suspect fraud by you or another person, we believe there has been an unusually high use of the service, any amount owing to us in respect of the service is not paid by the due date and you fail to pay that amount in full within 10 business days after we give you notice, we reasonably consider you a credit risk because any amount owing to us or another Elders group company is not paid by its due date and you fail to make that payment within the required period after receiving notice from us or an Elders group company, you breach a material term of this agreement and you either cannot remedy the breach or do not remedy the breach within 30 days after we give you notice to do so, we are required to do so to comply with an order, instruction, request or notice from a regulator, emergency services organisation, other competent authority or under law, there are problems connecting our network to a supplier's network, you become insolvent and we reasonably believe we

are unlikely to receive payment for amounts due, or you die or, if you are in a partnership, the partnership is dissolved and we reasonably believe we are unlikely to receive payment for the amounts due or we are otherwise entitled to do so under the agreement.

What happens if the service is suspended?

If the service is suspended you must pay an access fee while it is suspended. If the suspension was not as a result of circumstances attributable to you or non Elders-owned equipment you may be entitled on request to a refund or a rebate of access fees for the suspension period. If the suspension was a result of circumstances attributable to you, you may have to pay us a suspension fee and, if you wish to reactivate the service, a reconnection or reactivation fee.

Liability:

Your liability to us

You are liable to us for any breach of the agreement or if you act negligently. However you are not liable for any loss we suffer to the extent that it is caused by us. You are not liable to us for consequential loss or for any costs, expenses, loss or charges which are not a direct result of something you have done or failed to do. You indemnify us from and against any and all loss including consequential loss suffered or incurred by us in connection with a third party claim arising out of an act or omission by you or an end user in connection with the service provided to you.

Our liability to you

We accept liability to you in accordance with the Trade Practices Act and other laws. We may be liable to you in connection with the agreement and the supply or interruption of the service only to the extent provided in the agreement. We are not liable to you for consequential loss.

Assignment:

We may assign our rights under the agreement to any person with DCITA's prior written consent. We may transfer our obligations under the agreement to any Elders group company. We may perform any of our obligations by arranging for them to be performed by another person.

You may assign your rights under the agreement with our prior written consent. You may transfer your obligations under the agreement if the person you wish to transfer them to successfully meets the application requirements for the service.

Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program) provisions:

If we terminate our registration as an Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program) provider with the Department of Communications, Information Technology and the Arts (DCITA), we will give you 20 working

days notice of the termination of registration. If we terminate our registration as an Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program) provider, we will cease to provide the service but ownership of the customer premises equipment supplied and installed by us for you will reside with you.

If we cease supplying the service, and continue our registration and operation as an Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program) provider, we will give you 20 working days written notice of the proposed withdrawal of the service. We will offer to migrate you to a comparable Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program) service (if available) or to the "Threshold Service" we offer under the Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program) at no additional charge or provide reasonable assistance to transfer you to another Registered Program Provider (as defined under the Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program) guidelines).

Intellectual property:

You must not infringe another person's intellectual property rights in using the service. If you do so we may suspend or cancel the service without notice.

Commission

We may pay a commission to any of our personnel in connection with the agreement.

Information about your rights:

Information about your rights may be obtained by contacting the Australian Communications and Media Authority, the Telecommunications Industry Ombudsman, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission or the Department of Fair Trading or Department of Consumer Affairs in your state or territory.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE SERVICE:

Notification of changes to the agreement

You consent to us notifying you of changes to your primary email address. We may notify you of any changes to the agreement by posting on our website at http://www.elderstelcommunications.com.au/got_o/agreements.

Modifications to the service

We may modify aspects of the service and the delivery of the service to you if it is necessary for the efficient operation of our network.

What is not supplied by Elders:

The service does not include guaranteed satellite bandwidth; a continuous or fault-free service; a virtual private network (VPN); a domain name server service and registration functions; a public IP address for you or your end user unless explicitly included as part of the service; maintenance of equipment other than that



supplied by; gateway personal computer and associated applications to serve a LAN/WAN; secure integration; if you opt to connect your LAN to the service, delivery of the service beyond the service delivery point; or support for software not supplied by us, including software downloaded from the Internet.

We are not obliged to supply the service to certain locations as set out in the Elders Broadband Satellite (Australian Broadband Guarantee (Transitional Program)) Terms. We will not supply the service to you unless a standard installation can be carried out at the location where you request the service to be supplied unless otherwise agreed.

Equipment

In order to access the service you need equipment which is approved and meets the minimum system requirements as set out in the agreement. If your systems are different, it is your responsibility to configure and connect your computer equipment to the service and support your non-standard equipment. We will install, test and demonstrate the service up to the Ethernet port on the satellite modem.

Connection of the Service:

To be able to connect to the service you must: obtain all required licenses and any other approvals necessary, purchase equipment from us for the service, ensure your equipment not purchased from us is operational and available by the proposed service start date, establish and maintain any necessary connections for you to connect the purchased equipment to the service delivery point in accordance with our directions, ensure your computer has the minimum specifications set out in the agreement and provide us with all routing information reasonably necessary to provide the service. You indemnify us against any claim made against us by another person which arises out of your failure to obtain any necessary licences or approvals to perform the installation, relocation or removal of the service. We reserve the right to charge you, including for non-standard installation or re-installation or being unable to complete installation on an agreed date due to circumstances for which you are at fault.

You must reasonably co-operate with us to allow us, or a supplier, to establish and supply the service to you safely and efficiently. While we will take reasonable care not to cause any damage, our connection, inspection and maintenance of the service may cause damage to your computer software, hardware or data. It may also invalidate your computer warranty. You agree to accept the risk of any of these things occurring. You also agree to back up all existing computer files by copying them to another storage medium or other computer before we

perform the connection. We do not accept any responsibility or liability for any loss or damage it may cause to your computer, software, files, data or peripherals, even if the loss or damage is caused by a negligent act or omission of us or our personnel.

Use of the service

To be an account holder you must be 18 years of age or older, or if not, and if you are a consumer customer, you must have obtained the consent of a parent, teacher or other responsible adult to use the service.

We are not responsible for any Internet content that may be obtained via the service. We reserve the right to delete any username that we consider offensive, defamatory, illegal or otherwise inappropriate.

You must ensure that the software you use with the service is properly licensed. Subject to the agreement, you must not resell, share or otherwise distribute the service to a third party.

We may monitor your account to ensure you are complying with the agreement. We will investigate misuse of the service. If we find that you have misused the service we may recover from you any costs of investigating the misuse and any compensation we are required to pay to another user as a result of your misuse.

Warranties

In addition to any statutory warranty to which you may be entitled, we provide the maintenance period with equipment we supply to you at no extra cost. Some exceptions apply, for example travel charges for remote areas or faulty equipment due to your negligence or fraud.

If you move premises

We reserve the right to quote a relocation fee if you move to another location. The service may not be available in other locations.

Data usage limitations

Your pricing plan may set out a maximum amount of data that you can download in a billing month. If the amount of data that you download at high speed exceeds the data allowance in any billing month then access to your service will be speed limited or you must pay an additional data charge until your speed is limited. Any unused data allowance cannot be rolled over.

Acceptable Use Policy

You must comply with our Acceptable Use Policy, available at <http://www.elderstelecommunications.com.au/go/acceptableusepolicy> when using the service. This policy is designed to ensure that your use of the service does not break any laws, hinder the efficient operation of our network, interfere with the rights of Elders customers, or interfere more generally with the rights of Internet users.
